

Earth Day in Spain

In Spain, Earth Day is a fun and meaningful time when people learn how to care for the environment. Children in schools take part in activities that celebrate **la Tierra** (the Earth) and remind everyone how important it is to protect our planet.



Many schools organise outdoor activities like **la limpieza** (cleaning), where pupils help pick up rubbish in parks or on beaches. This helps protect **la naturaleza** (nature) and keeps habitats safe for animals. Children also learn about **el reciclaje** (recycling), sorting waste into the correct bins to reduce pollution.

Families and communities often take part in planting activities called **plantar árboles** (planting trees). This helps improve air quality and supports wildlife. Children may also explore gardens or countryside areas to learn about **las plantas** (plants) and how they grow.

In Spain, people are also encouraged to save energy, known as **ahorrar energía** (saving energy), by turning off lights and using less electricity at home.

Earth Day in Spain is all about working together, learning new ways to help the environment, and taking care of **el planeta** (the planet) for the future.
